



ISL Supplier Newsletter – December 2009

This is the first of the quarterly newsletters to be issued by ISL over the course of the financial year. This issue contains information relating to Mifare® Classic Phase Out, TCA Migration, HOPS maintenance, reminders and statistical information.

Mifare® Classic Customer Media Phase Out

ISL reminds all bureaus and in-house equipment providers that the deadline for new issuance of Mifare® Classic Customer Media is 31 December 2009. All must comply with a switch to alternative customer media sources before this date, all ISL ISAMs will have CMD1&3 keys suspended on 29 December 2009 to ensure full compliance on the part of all 249 ISL TCAs. As of Friday 18 December, 80% of ISL TCAs have successfully moved to alternative customer media sources – ISL thanks all who have participated in this phase out.

TCA Migration

ISL would remind all bureaus assisting ISL TCAs with the process of migration from ISL to individual Licensed Membership to provide ISL with regularly updated information. ISL TCAs will be required to complete Sections B & D of the ISL Migration Pack. Please note that ISL must be informed three months in advance of scheduled migration.

Scheduled HOPS Maintenance

There is impending downtime for ISL HOPS scheduled for Wednesday 6 January 2010, to allow for continued developments with stop listing and TCA Migration. As soon as further confirmed dates are scheduled ISL will forward this information.

Reminders

ISL would like to remind all suppliers to carefully monitor the use of authorised ISRN ranges and request further ISRN authorisation at suitably advanced notice. ISL would like to thank all bureaus for their co-operation during the programme of key rollover.
